Instruction card for Quickie Dispensers ingredient dispensing units

IMPORTANT

It is the responsibility of the purchaser to ensure that all persons that use the dispenser have read and understood these instructions.

MOUNTING

- This dispenser is for internal use only.
- Position the dispenser between 1.2 and 1.6 meters above floor level. Leave at least 100mm clearance above the top of the dispenser.
- Fix the dispenser firmly through each corner with 4mm diameter fasteners and ensure the unit is at least 300mm from any source of steam.

OPERATING

- TO LOAD - remove serve controller and jar by lifting the jar out taking care to clear the dispenser's arms. Then invert, unscrew and fill jar and then replace by reversal of the procedure for removal.
- TO DISPENSE - hold cup below the selected ingredient nozzle and turn the control handle. Each such actions dispenses one rounded teaspoon measure.

CAUTION

- ALWAYS ADD WATER LAST - steam can cause a residue of ingredient build up within the dispenser which lowers performance and increases risk of damage.
- NEVER APPLY EXTRA FORCE TO THE CONTROL HANDLES - damage to the serve controller may occur if force is applied against the stop. If the controller resists movement from its rest position, refer to maintenance below.
- If there is any damage to the serve controller, immediately discontinue use.
- Do not apply weight to the tray.

MAINTENANCE

- Serve controllers should be washed thoroughly in warm water each time the ingredient jar is refilled, and completely dried before re-using.
- All surfaces should be routinely wiped clean using warm water.

WARRANTY

- Quickie Dispensers warrants that, should this dispenser fail within 12 months of date of purchase, the faulty item will be repaired or replaced by Quickie Dispensers free of charge, provided that the failure is not due to improper use, misuse, abuse or failure to follow the instructions supplied.
- The warranty does not cover consequential damage to any other goods or property.
- The warranty will be rendered null and void if repair work is carried out by a non accredited person.
